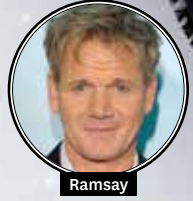


Cruise

Graham's Chronofighter Oversize Prodiver operates at a depth of 2,000 feet with a patented activation trigger to start, stop and reset the chronograph. Tom Cruise has been spotted wearing a Chronofighter; \$13,400, at Westime, Beverly Hills, and Kenjo, New York

Ulysse Nardin's limited-edition Blue Sea is encased in vulcanized rubber-coated stainless steel with a wave pattern face. It's ready for action with water resistance to 200 meters. \$10,900, at Tourneau TimeMachine, Kenjo and Cellini, New York and David Orgell, Beverly Hills

Linde Werdelin's roughly polished titanium Oktopus II is water-resistant to 300 meters. The brand's Reef digital diving attachment, which includes a compass and depth measure, can be snapped on to the watch case. \$9,880, totallyworthit.com
